Whiskers officially began taking in cats for rescue in April of 2018. Since that day, Whiskers has endeavored to become a resource for our community by actively advocating for the health and wellbeing of all cats. When I was considering taking on the challenge of starting a rescue, it was daunting. Yet, I saw an overwhelming need from which I could not turn away - the cats who needed more than the current standard of care available through most rescue groups and animal shelters; older cats who needed expensive health care to live out their golden years free of pain, the injured who might be saved with a surgical procedure and/or a safe place to recover, and the sick who needed in-depth diagnostics to search for a remedy and restore them to health.

It was my dream to create a rescue organization and a team who could be the heroes for these cats. There have been many tears of both grief and happiness shed since April 2018, every tear an expression of love. The people who saw merit in my dream have become part of the fabric of Whiskers. The good fortune to have many generous, caring individuals has made it possible to intervene on behalf of 563 high-risk cats as of year-end 2021.

Without access to world-class veterinarians and the latest in testing methods, many Whiskers cats would have gone undiagnosed and suffered instead of being lifted out of pain and into happy, pain-free lives. The veterinary clinics that work with Whiskers to provide care at discounted rates makes helping more cats possible. Their support, expertise, and partnership are an essential thread of our success. Our foster caregivers are invaluable: without safe, appropriate spaces for cats to heal and grow, we could not help more than a handful of cats. Every volunteer who is willing to take a bit of the load to make it all happen is an absolute treasure that I cherish beyond words. The people who have reached into their pockets and donated to help, a little or a lot, tie it all together. The harsh reality is that rescuing a life costs money. Every person playing a role and contributing what they can to create the Whiskers tapestry is immensely appreciated.

Whiskers and our wonderful donors give cats like Tucker, a shy friend, the opportunity to thrive in foster homes where they feel safe.


Providing Tucker's dental care had an enormous impact on the way he felt! Being painfree is a huge factor in cats being able to groom, play and interact with their environment.


